A. Overall Work Program (OWP) Planning Study Presentation: Active Transportation Monitoring Program Phase I-III

The City and County of Honolulu Department of Transportation Services will present on the Active Transportation Monitoring Program. This work element, funded through the Overall Work Programs Fiscal Year (FY) 2021 and FY22, consists of the collection and monitoring of active transportation data, such as people walking and riding bicycles. The data produced by this project will be used in the calibration and validation of OahuMPO's Travel Demand Forecasting Model.

This presentation will cover site selection, installation and validation of counters, data factor development, data dissemination and archiving.

Requested Action: Approve the presentation as evidence that the work was carried out, submit documentation of the work completed to the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) for approval, and incorporate study findings into the metropolitan transportation planning process.
