## Executive Director's Report

### *Grant Support for Mobility Hub Planning*

OahuMPO staff submitted a proposal for funding under the Transit Oriented Development (TOD) Capital Improvement Program from the Office of Planning and Sustainable Development's State TOD Council. If awarded the State funds, OahuMPO will carry out a planning study to evaluate the feasibility of establishing a multimodal mobility hub near the Kūwili Skyline Station in Iwilei. The goal of the study would be to assess locations near the Skyline station for a potential mobility hub to help improve transportation access to the Skyline station and improve overall connectivity and mobility of residents and visitors.

### *OahuMPO Open House*

The OahuMPO held an open house on July 24, to allow members of the public to visit our offices and meet staff, to learn more about what the MPO does. A total of 18 people attended in person and participated in a lively and informative discussion about transportation planning on Oahu. We hope to have this type of event on an annual basis.



### *Oahu Regional Transportation Plan (ORTP) 2050 Public Survey*

The OahuMPO distributed a community survey on August 1, to gather feedback from the public about the Policy Board approved goals and objectives of the ORTP 2050. Over the course of the month-long survey period, more than 1,000 Oahu residents participated in the survey. OahuMPO staff will be analyzing the collected data and will conduct a presentation of the findings to the CAC at next month's meeting.

### *Technical Advisory Committee (TAC)*

The TAC met on August 9.

They received a presentation on the Overall Work Program (OWP) funded Vision Zero Action Plan and voted to recommend the Policy Board approve the report. They also received a presentation regarding the proposed Regional Planning Priorities for the FY2026-2027 OWP. Finally, they received a summary of the Vision Zero Mobile

Workshop in New York City and Northern Europe, attended by Policy Board Vice-Chair Val Okimoto and Executive Director Mark Garrity.

Their next meeting is scheduled for September 13 at 9:00 AM.

### *Policy Board*

The Policy Board met on August 26.

They received a presentation on a proposed application for a USDOT Safe Streets for All (SS4A) grant and voted to direct OahuMPO staff to apply. They received a presentation on the Overall Work Program (OWP) funded Vision Zero Action Plan and voted to approve the report. They also received a presentation regarding the potential OahuMPO Regional Planning Priorities for the FY2026-2027 OWP and voted to approve the proposed priorities.

Their next meeting is scheduled for September 30 at 11:00 AM.
