Executive Director's Report

Community Outreach for the ORTP 2050

On August 30, the OahuMPO wrapped up our most recent on-line public survey, to gather feedback on the ORTP 2050 Goals and Objectives. Over 1000 Oahu residents participated in the survey representing all age groups, ethnicities, income brackets and planning areas. Analysis of the results indicates a high level of public support for active and public transportation, with an emphasis on sidewalks and bikeways, bus rapid transit, and Skyline extensions. The OahuMPO has been conducting educational outreach, and the results of the survey show that the public associates increased safety with better infrastructure for active transportation. Policy Board

The Policy Board met on September 30.

They received a presentation on the Educational Framework for Youth Engagement in Transportation Planning study and voted to accept the report as evidence that the work was carried out. They received a presentation on possible Vision Zero Actions Involving Legislation as a follow up to the presentation in August to close out the Vision Zero Action Plan.

Their next meeting is scheduled for October 28 at 11:00 AM.

Citizen Advisory Committee (CAC)

The CAC met on October 2.

They received a presentation on the Vision Zero Mobile Workshop attended by the Policy Board Vice-Chair Val Okimoto and Executive Director Mark Garrity in June. They considered a CAC membership application from Neighborhood Board #12 (Nuuanu-Punchbowl) and passed a motion to recommend that the Policy Board approve the application. They received a presentation on the first draft list of planning activities to be proposed for inclusion in the Overall Work Program FY2026-

2027. They received an update on the needs assessment conducted for the State Government Employee Transportation Demand Management Study.

Their next meeting is scheduled for November 6 at 2:30 PM.
